

Protect your interests – get your Stamp Certificate



You will need the Stamp Certificate to pursue legal action* in the event of disputes such as:



Sudden termination
of rental without
valid reason



Poor maintenance
of common areas
of property



Sudden increase in
rent above market
value during tenancy



Security deposit
being held without
valid reason



It is required by law to submit a stamping record and pay stamp duty on tenancy agreements.

How do you obtain the Stamp Certificate?

With your tenancy agreement...

- ✓ Log in to [myTax Portal – Stamp Duty](#)
- ✓ Under “Stamping”, select “Stamp Lease and Tenancy Documents”
- ✓ Submit a stamping record
- ✓ Pay stamp duty
- ✓ Download the Stamp Certificate
