


Your 5-minute Guide to TAX FILING 2019

DO I NEED TO FILE MY RETURN THIS YEAR?



1 File at **mytax.iras.gov.sg** from 1 Mar 2019 to 18 Apr 2019. Verify the employment income and deductions that have been auto-included in your return.

2 Look out for your Notice of Assessment (NOA) from Jun 2019.

3 Check that your NOA is accurate. If your NOA does not include all your income or shows incorrect relief claims, inform IRAS via the "Object to Assessment" e-Service on myTax Portal.

1 Log in to **mytax.iras.gov.sg** to preview your Notice of Assessment (NOA). You can request for an early assessment before 19 Apr 2019. Alternatively, you will receive your NOA from end Apr 2019.

2 Check that your NOA is accurate. If your NOA does not include all your income or shows incorrect relief claims, inform IRAS via the "Object to Assessment" e-Service on myTax Portal.

SIMPLE 4-STEP CHECKLIST FOR TAX FILING

1 Be SingPass 2FA ready to file
SingPass 2FA is needed for log in to myTax Portal. For quicker logins, download **SingPass Mobile** at **www.singpassmobile.sg** today.



2 Reliefs. Rebates. Deductions.
Check your eligibility with the Personal Reliefs Eligibility Tool at **www.iras.gov.sg**.



3 File from 1 Mar 2019
File on-the-go at **mytax.iras.gov.sg** by 18 Apr 2019. File early to give yourself sufficient time to check the pre-filled information.



4 Sign up and pay by GIRO
Get instant approval from DBS and OCBC bank when you sign up to pay your income tax in GIRO instalments at **mytax.iras.gov.sg**. Payment for taxes by cheque will no longer be accepted at all SingPost branches from 1 Mar 2019.



*For salaried employees only. If you are self-employed, please file a tax return if your annual net business income exceeded \$6,000 in 2018.
