Largest Box of Coins in the Singapore Book of Records

As part of the fundraising efforts of the Inland Revenue Recreation Club, the IRAS staff club, we had encouraged all staff to collect their 'loose change' and gave each staff a coin bank in which they were encouraged to deposit their charity contributions. The coins were then housed in a giant coin box, which is the 'A Million Coins for the Nation' structure.

This structure had been installed on the first floor of Revenue House since June 2012 and had seen steadily rising coin levels. With President Tony Tan Keng Yam's help, we filled the structure to the brim today, setting a new record for the 'Largest Box of Coins' in the Singapore Book of Records. The coin box measures 1.64 m by 0.41 m by 1.02 m.
